A reading from the Old Testament 1 Kings 19 15-16, 19-end

15 The Lord said to him, "Go back the way you came, and go to the Desert of Damascus. When you get there, anoint Hazael king over Aram. 16 Also, anoint Jehu son of Nimshi king over Israel, and anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet.

The Call of Elisha

19 So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was ploughing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him. 20 Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye," he said, "and then I will come with you."

"Go back," Elijah replied. "What have I done to you?"

21 So Elisha left him and went back. He took his yoke of oxen and slaughtered them. He burned the ploughing equipment to cook the meat and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out to follow Elijah and became his servant.

A reading from the New Testament Galatians 5. 1, 13-25

5 1 For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.13 For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. 14 For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' 15 If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

## The Works of the Flesh

16 Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. 17 For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. 19 Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, 21 envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

# The Fruit of the Spirit

There is no law against such things. 24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; 53 but they did not receive him, because his face was set towards Jerusalem. 54 When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, 'Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?'] 55 But he turned and rebuked them. 56 Then[I] they went on to another village.

# Would-Be Followers of Jesus

Glory to you O Lord

57 As they were going along the road, someone said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' 58 And Jesus said to him, 'Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' 59 To another he said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father.' 60 But Jesus said to him, 'Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.' 61 Another said, 'I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home.' 62 Jesus said to him, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

Reflection

Elisha's call to follow Elijah is not like other prophetic calls in the Old Testament. There is no vision of angelic hosts like Isaiah or the burning bush of Moses. Elisha's call does not involve any direct encounter with God at all. Instead, it is the prophet Elijah who initiates his change in vocation.

It all feels very domestic and unexceptional. Elisha is just going about his daily work, walking behind the oxen ploughing, when Elijah walks up to him and throws his cloak around him. Quite what this may have signalled at that time we do not know. It may have been a recognised way of calling another to

follow, to become a companion or in Elisha's case, more of an apprentice. This was common among prophets.

Certainly, Elisha understood the significance. He is to be a follower and servant - a disciple, as it were -- of this holy man. Such an apprenticeship with the prophet likely implied succession. Later, after Elijah is taken up into heaven, Elisha will begin to exhibit prophetic powers, but when Elijah first calls Elisha, he calls him just to be a discipleship.

Elisha makes a complete break with his former life. It was a life of some substance; to own twelve oxen signified wealth. Elijah's question, "Go back, for what have I done to you?" may be a rhetorical rebuke, but it may also be a question for which Elisha, at least for himself, must provide a real answer. What claim does this call make on his life? What ties must he leave behind?

He slaughters the oxen that had previously provided his livelihood; has a farewell feast for his family – and leaves. This is a powerful statement of vocational commitment. There is no going back to his former way of life.

It is thus understandable if Elisha's call brings to mind New Testament accounts of the calls of Jesus' disciples. All four Gospel accounts describe Jesus addressing the soon-to-be disciples with the call, "Follow me." With no hesitation, they put down their old work and take up this new vocation. It can seem absurd in its abruptness. Where is the risk assessment? Where is the accounting of their savings or their retirement portfolios? Why aren't they holding out for 2.5 children and a house on a cul-de-sac instead?

A commitment to discipleship requires an about-face, a total turn away from the world's values and toward God's. The Bible witnesses to the nature of this call again and again, be it in the story of Moses and the burning bush, of Elisha under Elijah's mantle, or of the disciples' setting down their nets. I am reminded of the hymn "I have decided to follow Jesus," which sums up this commitment to discipleship in starkly poignant terms: "The world behind me, the cross before me, no turning back, no turning back."

The months and years of our lives quickly pass – we have limited time, and Paul tells us that we must redeem the time that we have – take hold of it and use it well.

Elijah was not with Elisha for long, nor Jesus with the disciples, but both he and they and we were called with 'succession in mind'. The mantle has passed to us.

What have we done with our lives since we have responded to the call of Christ? This is not a question to cause us to stress, but we are to respond.

People often say, "If I knew the will of God I would do it." as if God makes it difficult. But really, we know. Being a disciple by its very nature implies relationship, a sharing of our lives. Being sensitive to what the other is saying or showing us, and we have the added advantage of the continuous presence of the Holy Spirit as our guide.

It is not hard therefore, to know. Prayer and study of God's word; the willingness to do what often is so obvious and 'beneath our hand' and we sometimes choose to ignore (write the letter, make the call, give the money); determine to live in love with all as much as lies within us, quickly forgiving and asking forgiveness, 'to do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God'.

I find that it is most usually not a question of what I should do but what will I do. Jesus said if you love me, you will obey me – I often forget that bit.

But there is always a fresh start – a new beginning – the call is always there. Courage is the quiet voice at the end of the day, saying, "Tomorrow I will try again."

Jesus said unto Simon, Fear not, from henceforth thou shalt catch men.

And... they forsook all and followed him.
